

AFRICAN AMERICAN HERITAGE CORPO



The Corridor Headquarters Building is where your walking tour begins. Start by learning about the events taking place year 'round in the Corridor, its history and its Anchors.

Then stroll over to **WUFO Black Radio History Collective** where you will learn about the exciting history of Black Radio in Buffalo.

Next door is the **Colored Musicians** Club & Jazz **Museum** where you will find musical displays & instruments from the glory days of Buffalo jazz, and hear stories about well-known musicians and club members.

Around the corner is Michigan Street **Baptist Church** where you will discover how it served as a station for the Underground Railroad, providing sanctuary to Freedom Seekers.
